		We are seeking to expand the dry storage area of the pantry by building an 2100 square foot addition attached to the		
		current building. Our current dry storage is in the basement, and is limited as the building is only 750 square feet.		
		We also have to manually load trucks and haul the food to the upper level to prepare for the next pantry distribution.		
		The new storage space, on the same level, more than triples dry food storage. With more storage, we will have a		
		more stable food supply that will enable to us to distribute nutritious dry goods, such as soup, fruit, pasta, canned
