<b>Family Promise of the Lakeshore</b>	Family Promise of the Lakeshore Oceana County Prevention and Stabilization Program 2025	This request will be used to assist families experiencing a temporary emergency that could lead to the loss of housing. It will provide financial assistance for essentials like rent, mortgage payment, utilities, food, car repairs, medication, gas and other essentials in order to ease the temporary burden, so that an emergency such as illness does not cause a family with limited income or living pay check to paycheck to lose housing. The goal is to prevent housing loss before it gets to eviction or foreclosure. By supplying simple yet vital resources—like fans for summer heat or liquid nutrition for patients who cannot eat—the fund significantly enhances the quality of life for individuals in their final days. Our heartbeat is around serving students who ordinarily wouldn't get a opportunity. We feel the platform described in this grant request at school districts is where we make the most impact and have the greatest opportunity to make a difference. First Tee is inclusive, students from all walks of life are welcomed into our program. <b>Lakeshore Children's Advocacy Center - Ludington</b>	Expanding Services for Oceana Child Abuse Victims	Lakeshore CAC is seeking support from the Oceana Community Foundation for direct services for children living in Oceana County who have experienced abuse, as well as their non-offending family members. On January 24, 2025 an interagency agreement was formalized between Lakeshore CAC and Oceana County. Lakeshore CAC provides forensic interviews, family advocacy, trauma therapy, court preparation, and case coordination for child abuse cases in Oceana County. The expansion of our service area leads to increased costs to our organization. <b>Local Animal Shelter Support Inc</b>	Fenced Exercise Area for Oceana County Animal Shelter	LASSI hopes to help provide funding and labor for construction of an 8' high fenced exercise area for dogs at the Oceana County Animal Shelter. There is an enclosure now, but volunteers and dogs must vacate if someone is visiting to consider adopting a dog. This is unfair to the animal and not helpful for their health. A fenced area is important because shelter dogs needs to be off leash with room to exercise daily to have the best chance of staying well-adjusted while awaiting their forever homes. They need to play, release energy, socialize with people, and enjoy a bit of freedom. We will assist youth (ages 16-24) and adults to determine their career cluster and expand their pursuit of training by preparing them for employment into apprenticeships. We will accomplish this through credentials, short-term work experiences, talent specialist one-on-one counseling and soft skills development. <b>Oceana County Parks &amp; Recreation Commission</b>	Cedar Point Park Accessibility Improvements	Imagine a park where everyone regardless of mobility can gather, share meals, and enjoy the outdoors together. Accessible picnic area makes this vision a reality. Unlike picnic areas of yesteryear, the purpose of the grant will provide dedicated spaces for wheelchair users, ensuring that no one is left on the sidelines. These accessible picnic areas will foster inclusiveness, allowing families, friends, and community members of all abilities to sit together comfortably. They also support the growing need for accessible public spaces, aligning with ADA guidelines and demonstrating a commitment to equity. It will also include photos where available of these individuals, or of people from the same time period. <b>Pentwater Township</b>	Pentwater Community Beachfront Restoration	The Pentwater community has long been challenged by the impacts of wind-blown sand on the public beachfront at Mears State Park and adjacent public properties. Reconfiguring infrastructure and restoring native dune habitat using nature-based solutions will reduce these impacts. Completion of this project will ensure the long-term protection of public amenities by stabilizing the Lake Michigan shoreline, improving environmental biodiversity, maintaining economic viability, and improving accessibility for visitors. <b>Trinity Lutheran Church</b>	Trinity Community Food Pantry Building Expansion	We are seeking to expand the dry storage area of the pantry by building an 2100 square foot addition attached to the current building. Our current dry storage is in the basement, and is limited as the building is only 750 square feet. We also have to manually load trucks and haul the food to the upper level to prepare for the next pantry distribution. The new storage space, on the same level, more than triples dry food storage. With more storage, we will have a more stable food supply that will enable to us to distribute nutritious dry goods, such as soup, fruit, pasta, canned vegetables, oatmeal, cereal, peanut butter and canned meats. <b>Village of Hesperia</b>	HesperiaART Initiative	HesperiaART is a community-driven public art program designed to celebrate Hesperia as "The Hub of Vacationland." Through vibrant, engaging and locally inspired art installations, we will enhance public spaces, foster community pride, and attract visitors to experience the creative spirit of our community. The long term goal is to raise \$100,000 and install six pieces of artwork, focusing on downtown, prioritizing community engagement and creative collaboration to ensure a long-term impact. <b>We Want The Land Coalition Inc.</b>	Removal and Control of Invasive Autumn Olive	We Want The Land Coalition, Inc. (WWTLC), aims to manage and eradicate the invasive autumn olive species on our 650-acre property in Walkerville, MI. Last year, we organized two different weekend work sessions with 12-15 dedicated women volunteers, who camped rustically and tackled this challenging task. Despite our efforts, limited power tools and time constraints hindered our progress. This year, we plan a ten-day work period with up to 20 volunteers and better power tools to improve efficiency and reduce physical strain. We are partnering with the Land Conservancy of West Michigan and the Oceana Conservation District. Defined learning will provide 100 site licenses to be used in the Oceana County School Districts to service secondary special education students.
